PRIME CATTLE: 44 HEAD

Increased numbers of variable quality cattle, were easily handled by the usual buyers at ringside, who all had stronger appetites for stock. Commercial cattle off grass would be 2p dearer on the week and benefitting from the good supply of summer grass certainly pulled the scales round. Inside cattle saw demand as strong as ever with butcher demand at ringside especially for heifers well above deadweight prices.

BULLS:5 HEAD

A small selection of overage animals, some short of flesh met a good market, from all parts of the ring, and more could been have sold to advantage. The section was topped by 163p for a 19m bull from Messrs Evans, Abbey Farm. Top price per head was £993 again for a Simmental.

STEERS:17 HEAD

A better selection of steers seen for some time, with some superb, super heavyweight types. Demand was strong for all weights, but it was limited for 730 Kilo's plus. Topping the section at 200p was a pair of continentals from Terry Kennealy, followed at 192p from Roger and Tom. Messrs Lee sold South- Devons to 186p, Shorthorns from James Fanshawe achieved 180p. Top price per head was £1338 from Hemel Hempstead.

HEIFERS:21 HEAD

Shed cattle, grass cattle and all breeds were forward, demand was strong from ringside with the best 200p plus and commercial 170-187p. Prime Lambs: 2948 Forward SQQ 183p/kg

A big yarding of 2950 lambs today as producers begin to wean. Alarmingly only 1500 of these booked in prior to the sale!! Trade hard work although on reflection an SQQ of 183p/kg the highest posted for the day nationally. Trade today depressed by a wealth of lean lambs and also lambs under weight. Trade sticky throughout albeit at 47% todays SQQ returns a deadweight equivalent without a grid of 3.90p/kg, showing our trade to be well ahead of comparison. How low must some kill sheets be showing lambs per head?. Export lambs as ever best supported selling to 234p/kg for IM Allen & Partners, Lutterworth with 38.5kg Beltex. Light lambs generally hard to sell but best shaped 34kg from C Tarry sold to 218p/kg and 36kg from G R Fountaine 217p/kg. 40kg from Messrs Allen & Partners 215p/kg and 210p/kg. In the heavies a harder sell today but topping at 200p/kg for 49kg for Andrew Bishop of Tewkesbury with 46kg from J Webster 196p/kg equal with PD & DM Hopcraft. Best finished lambs holding a huge premium and more than paying for the effort. In the lump a top for the handy weights of £92 for 45kg from A Bishop ahead of £91 for 44.5kg from R Richins, Oxford and £90 for 38.5kg from Messrs Allen Partners. Heavies today easy to sell if weighted but 45 to 48kg remain a largely unsupported weight band with little Supermarket demand within the UK. S & J Farming saw 51kg to £93 wit FJ Tombs & Son 54kg £95 and 57kg £96 although top for the day weight and shape at 49kg from Messrs Bishop at £98.

Seemingly although trade hard to stomach, we have had the best of it for the day and producers are reminded to ensure the required returns that they get finish on lambs and also pre-book stock. Lean lambs and those likely to die at weights under 17kg face little competition with Hill sheep and Wether lambs filling these order in the north for discounted rates. The days of local Abbatoirs being able to pitch such goods into Europe have gone and finish is essential.

The Pre-Sale Show ably judged by Mr Richard Pedley, Kirkby Lonsdale and Mr Joshua Nunnerley, Banbury saw a fantastic show of 247 quality North Country Mules pass through the show ring for consideration. We thank all competitors, Judges and Staff, together with our Sponsors. Results as follow;

Trade on the day starting surprisingly steadily with aged Ewes much harder to sell than the first breeding sheep sale with early lambing flocks fully fitted. Top for the section, pens full at £116, from Will Gaydon of Suffolk FM with Texels £105 and similar aged from Dukes Meadow Farms £105 for Lleyns. Double Theaves a steady firm trade selling to £120 twice for 39 NCM Doubles from Martin Woodward others £118 from Niel Sheppherd.

Into the Theaves and as per the rest of the season Continental Theaves hotly contested seeing a top of £201 with Tex x Theaves from S Gore others £197 from the same home. Strong smart Texels from L C Threadgold & Son saw big pens at £159 and first timer F Hodgkins £152. Similar goods from Messrs Threadgold £145. No real show stoppers in the section but clear headed strong Theaves well supported. Suffolks not the quality of the first sale but topping at £136 from I Newton & Son ahead of James Arrowsmith at £135 and £134 whom sold others at £130. S Gore though top of the tree again selling a pair of Pure Suffoks to £190. Cheviots variable with quality hotly contested to £160 for Z Collett others £131. Scotch Half Bred £145 from Gate Farming.

On into the Mules which saw a 'second sitting' of customers coming to ringside for replacements resulting in a trade that started swiftly and gathered momentum to leave an avg of £134. A transparent draw system saw Henry Tustian having to be second into bat commencing with his 3rd place single Theave which was donated to Cancer Research. The Theave sold for £300 first to Hillside Farm before being put back up to be bought at £230 by M J Woodward who offered the Theave for resale bought at £230 by Kelby Stephens. Our Thanks to Henry, his family and the three buyers. The Deeming Family later donating a further £100 to the fund, Thankyou. On with the main business saw Henry's second single lamb sell to £232 setting the trend for the following pen of Champion Theaves, which after various phone bids eventually sold to £220 the pick of Messrs NC Marsden, Cockermouth. The second placed pen from the family received similar interest on the phone and from around the ring before selling to £180. The run taking £165,£162 and £152 with the consignment of 195 North Country Mules averaging £149. Swift demand throughout whatever the number with R H Mole travelling up to show a pen of 32 to £140. Theaves having lambed the pick of the day albeit those ran dry regularly £130 plus with sharpest headed Theaves rewarded seeing ran dry Theaves from W H Allen £140. A strong run of dry powerful Theaves from, GC & RE Greaves, Uttoxeter saw a top of £150 with others £145 and £144 with the consignment of 153 averaging £137. Onto 3rd Placed pens from the Family Collett selling to £170 with others £159. HH Wadland enjoyed a good following selling to £142 for two pens in a row before a consignment of 253 genuine Estate sheep from Cottesbrooke Estates sold to £140 and £138. Trade remaining throughout when SF & AJ Deeming sold there last offering of the year seeing the second placed single Theave make £195 and then the remaining pen full £169. A day of optimism and trade that reflected quality perfectly with those showing a wonderful selection of Theaves rewarded and the lesser farmed sorts traded as appropriate.

NSA RAM FAIR 30th AUGUST

The company welcomed the NSA (eastern region) to Stoneleigh Market on Friday 30 August for their 11th annual sale of of MV Accredited Rams. The Catalogue entry of 162 Rams was 40% up on the year, with over several breeds represented both pure and crossbred. Prior to the sale the show for the best pen of three's was in the capable hands of Johnny Metticola Shepherd to various producers of prime lambs. He went about his task looking for the modern type of ram, used by himself and his clients. His final line-up for the Championship saw P.Barnes's , Texels, Geoff Biddulph's Charolais, and finally Messrs Cook's Suffolks. After some deliberation he gave the nod to Geoff Biddulphs pen of Charolais which were awarded the Heygates Perpetual Trophy.

The sale commenced at 2 p.m. where an excellent crowd of potential buyers at ringside some places 2 and 3 people deep.

Trade was tremendous throughout with a 76% clearance, buyers were looking for well grown, good muscled Rams and were prepared to pay for them, the sale averaged 456 gns. Barbara Smith's Texels topped the sale at 660 gns for the leader from her 2nd prize pen, another realized 640gns. James Theyer a new seller sold Texels to 630gns. Mr.C.D.Timm, sold Beltex-Charolais to 650gns. Charolais's from local breeder Alan Thomas sold to 600gns, the champion pen from Geoff Biddulph, possibly suffered by being at the end of the sale, but sold to 590gns and averaged 564gns. Traditional breeds were topped at 560gns from Messrs Cook for a Suffolk from his prizewinning pen.

! CHAIRMANS UPDATE!

Please see below a letter received from the Estates Manager, Colin Hooper, in regards to the proposed relocation of the Market.

There is obviously a lot of work going on behind the scenes, but the below acts as an update on the current hurdles dictating as to the validity of the project.

Dear Tom,

Thanks for your email enquiring about progress on the relocation of the RFM and for coming to the office to discuss the project.

As I explained, planning permission has been approved for the new building and last autumn the construction contract was successfully tendered thus confirming the cost of the project. All this information has been supplied to HS2 so it can assess the detail. Since submitting the information, HS2 has been undertaking its own surveys and cost analysis to confirm the results we supplied. This work was completed very recently and the HS2 property team have prepared a paper which is now due to go to HS2 Governance Committee for final sign off. I have been told that the Committee are expected to respond by the end of October.

Assuming the project to approved by HS2 it will be at that point we will need to finalise details with RFM.

I trust the above is clear but should you have any questions please give me a call.


