Best end lambs still well chased topping at 335p/kg for 40kg and 323p/kg for 37.5kg from W Bartlett up from Buckingham. Blue Texels from PA & HM Coles saw 39kg to 310p/kg. Heavies the order of the day throughout seeing a top at 279p/kg for 48kg for Stimson Farming & Co with 47kg to 274p/kg from DS & LA Wadland and 51kg 269p/kg for W Bartlett and Humphrey Livestock at 51 and 52kg. An all in avg of £112 a continued good fortune despite the downturn. Export weights to £134 at 40kg with Messrs Wadland 45kg to £132 on two occasions and FH Everett & Son 44kg at £128 and Stimson Farming 45.5kg £128. Heavies topping at £146 for 58kg from Stimson Farming and 55kg to £142 for DS & LE Wadland and 59kg to £142 for W Bartlett RJ Batchelor and Humphrey Livestock all £140. Trade very difficult at the moment but we can only make trade equal to alternative outlets.

Talk of the day quite obviously the drought we have witnessed and the effects starting to show in the sheep with quality and bloom markedly down on the year. Thankfully a large number of travelled buyers this year with Welsh and Northern Counties taking a large proportion of sheep to graze the flush of grass they are now witnessing.

Aged Ewes a very hard sell with limited interest topping at £140 for 6t NCM from Jonjoe Morris and £138 for Suffolks from RAE Wilson.

Into the Theaves and best end Theaves as dear as we have seen in the Continentals with Texels topping out at £375 for Leam Faming Partnership whom also sold at £230 and £200. P Batchelor took £300 for Beltex and others at £190 with Fordwell Farm Partners up from the south to take £310. S Gore £270, £242 and £210. Best end Tex x generally £160 to £170 with a top of £195.50 for super sorts from MJ Woodward with middle of the road trading £130 to £150 and a difficult trade throughout. Suffolks much the same as Suffolks seeing a top of £188 on two pens from DJ Haycock & Son whom also sold at £182 and Messrs King £172. Cheviot Mules short on quality but selling to £220 for Jonioe Morris.

A large proportion of the Mules today selling to travelled customers with large proportions going back to Wales and Scottish Borders in search of grass. Best end sheep a swift trade and regularly hovering either side of £200. Theaves having lambed and being in good condition the favoured commodity with those having lambed and weathered badly being the largest drop on the year. Ran dry sheep well chased for best end sorts albeit second quality a harder sell with £150 seemingly the cap on these. Good runs from Messrs Cannon started us off well selling at £192.50 to £188 for the run of 100. Special note to J & H Tustian whom sold 130 to avg a marvellous £213. Trade an honest reflection of Farming conditions with the Weather and the top three inches of the land we far currently reminding all whom is in control.
